John David Greer, 82, of Vandalia, died at 8:40am, September 8, 2014 at his home in Vandalia.

Services for John David will be held at 10:30am, Saturday, September 13, 2014 at the First Presbyterian Church in Vandalia with Rev. Kurt Simon officiating. Visitation will be held one hour prior to services at the church. Burial will follow in Fairlawn Cemetery, Vandalia, military rites accorded at graveside by Crawford-Hale American Legion Post # 95, Vandalia, IL. John David was born in Vandalia on September 12, 1931, son of Dr. Miller Greer and Elizabeth McMackin Greer. He graduated from Vandalia High School and Westminster College in Fulton, MO.
