Services for Mr. Hartzel will be held at 10:00am, Tuesday, January 19, 2016 at Hohlt & File Funeral Home, Vandalia with Rev. Carl Rhodes officiating, visitation will be held one hour prior to services at the funeral home. Burial will follow at 3:00pm, Tuesday, January 19, 2016 at Lake View Memorial Gardens, Fairview Heights, IL with military honors.
