Mrs. Washburn was preceded in death by her parents and brothers, Gerald Willms, Frederick Willms Sr., and H. Donald Willms.






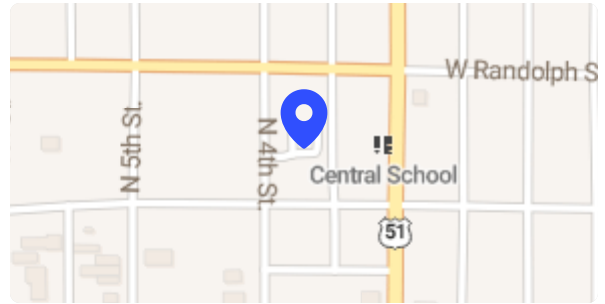
